



Process for living in a Community Integrated Living Arrangement (CILA)

1. The individual must meet the criteria and go through one of the Individual Service Coordination (ISC) agencies contracted by the state, after being selected from the Prioritization of Urgency of Need (PUNS) list. Our ISC is Champaign County Regional Planning Commission (CCRPC) which serves McLean County as well.
2. The individual may be placed on the PUNS list by their parent/guardian at any time to identify their Intellectual Disability (ID) and needs.
3. Once an individual is selected from the PUNS list, parent/guardian can search for a provider.
4. To apply for CILA funding, the individual must have a designated agency in place. They will apply through this agency.
5. Persons served in a CILA are 18 years of age or older with an ID acquired by the age of 18.
6. CILAs are funded through Department of Developmental Disabilities (DDD) within Department of Human Services (DHS).
 - a. Agency is regulated by Rule 115/116 for CILA and medication administration through Bureau of Quality Management (BQM) and Bureau of Accreditation Licensure and Certification (BALC).
 - b. Agency is regulated by Rule 150 for prevention and investigations of abuse, neglect and financial exploitation by the Office of Inspector General (OIG).
7. Each resident will receive an award letter with itemized funding based on their health, abilities & behaviors.
8. Placement of the individual with an agency must take place within six months from receipt of the award letter.
